

Shopping (local)

Schönhauser Alle has a mass of shops. There's literally everything there. Regular supermarkets and 'Bio' Markts (organic supermarkets), are plenty. Schönhauser Alle Arcaden is just a short walk away and has all the shops you'd expect to find in any shopping mall. It's situated right by the U & S bahn stations. (Schönhauser Allee 80)

KAISER'S

Schönhauser Allee Arcaden
Opposite U bahn
Lower level at end.

Supermarket. There's also a 'Netto' supermarket on the lower floor as soon as you walk in the arcade. There's another 'Kaiser' in Schönhauser Allee/ corner of Mila Straße is open 24hrs (Monday to Saturday).

POSTBANK (Post Office)

Schönhauser Allee Arcaden
Opposite U bahn
Ground level at end next to C&A

Always seems to be busy but it's a regular Post Office. Stamps are available from vending machines in the lobby to avoid queuing.

BISQUITTE (Baker & Café)

Schönhauser Allee 114
Out of Apartments Berlin, turn left and at the end of Erich-Weinert. str. on the right.
Basically, there's a Baker wherever you turn your head in Berlin and most double up as a Café. Bisquitte is probably the nearest to the apartments and they do a great früstück (breakfast) for €3.49!!

Shopping (a bit more further afield)

ALEXANDERPLATZ - [Map](#)

Jump on the U bahn (U2) at Schönhauser Allee and 4 stops south you'll find Alexanderplatz or 'Alex' as it's known locally. There you'll find many shops, bars and restaurants, including 'KAUFHAUS', a large, rather classy department store.

LEIPZIGERPLATZ - [LP12 \(Mall of Berlin\)](#)

The shopping center is located directly on Leipziger Platz near Potsdamer Platz and offers a mix of fashion, art, sports and gastronomy - and it's massive!

FRIEDRICHSTRAÙE - [Map](#)

A pleasant stroll down Unter Den Linden, Friedrichstrasse is a major crossing about halfway from Alexanderplatz and the Brandenburg Gate. It's the most legendary street in the whole city and combines the tradition of the "Golden Twenties" with the architecture of the New Berlin. With its newly decorated buildings, exclusive offices and coffee shops one can feel the spirit of New York in the heart of Berlin. French savoir vivre can be found in the Galeries Lafayette. The posh boutiques and the department stores Quartiers 205 / 206 offer design and fashion for the exquisite taste.

TAUENTZIENSTRAÙE & KURFÜRSTENDAMM - [Map](#)

Jump on the U bahn (U2) at Schönhauser Alle again and get off at Wittenbergplatz on the west-side of Berlin. Here, begins Kurfürstendamm, a long street that's full of shops. You'll see the first being [KaDeWe](#), actually in Tauentzienstr., which continues into 'Kudamm' probably the creme de la creme of department stores - apparently the largest in Europe. There's also a considerable amount of designer stores, further down the street at the Wilmersdorf end - Gucci, Rolex, Armani, Louis Vuitton, Versace and so on...
